



Lesson Plan: Ecosystem Exploration - Treetop Adventure

Objective: Study local flora and fauna and understand their roles in the ecosystem.

Duration: 2.5 hours

Materials:

- Field guides or identification books
- Binoculars (for bird watching)
- Notebooks and pencils

Introduction (15 minutes):

1. Brief students on the importance of ecosystems and the role of flora and fauna.
2. Introduce some common species they might encounter during the tour.

Activity (1 hour 30 minutes):

1. Treetop Canopy Tour:

Application (15 minutes):

1. Ecosystem Chart Creation:
 - Students use their notes to create a chart or diagram showcasing the species they observed and their interrelations.

Conclusion (10 minutes):

1. Highlight the importance of biodiversity and conservation.
2. Discuss how every organism, no matter how small, plays a crucial role in the ecosystem.
